

**CHAPTER 9  
SECTION 3A**

**CANCELLATION OF LEAVE TO ENTER**

**LEAVE TO ENTER FORMULAE FOR PERSONS WHO HAVE OBTAINED LEAVE  
TO ENTER BEFORE ARRIVAL IN THE UK (PARAGRAPH 321A OF HC 395)**

**Grounds on which leave is to be cancelled at a PORT OF ENTRY or if appropriate whilst the holder is outside of the UK**

**“You were given leave to enter the United Kingdom on (date) ...”**

In the case of a visa national whose leave is cancelled under Paragraph 321A of HC 395, one of the formulae below, as appropriate, should be used alone, irrespective of the period for which s/he seeks entry.

**False representations employed/material facts not disclosed/change of circumstances**

"... but I am satisfied that (false representations were employed or material facts were not disclosed for the purpose of obtaining the leave) (or there has been such a change of circumstances in your case since the leave was granted that it should be cancelled) . I therefore cancel your leave to (enter) (remain).

**Paragraph 321A (1)(2) 704**

Cancellation Code

**Medical grounds**

"... but I satisfied that it is undesirable to admit you to the United Kingdom for the following medical reasons (.....). You are not settled in the United Kingdom and I am not satisfied that there are strong compassionate reasons justifying your admission. I therefore cancel your leave to (enter) (remain) on medical grounds.

**Exclusion conducive to the public good – Direction of Secretary of State**

“... but the Secretary of State has personally directed that your exclusion from the United Kingdom is conducive to the public good. I therefore cancel your leave to (enter) (remain).

**Paragraph 321A (4) 704****Exclusion conducive to the public good – Immigration Officer’s discretion**

“... but from information available to me, it seems right to cancel your leave on the ground that your exclusion from the UK is conducive to the public good. I therefore cancel your leave to (enter) (remain).

**Paragraph 321A(5) 704****Exclusion conducive to the public good – Drugs cases**

“... but you have subsequently been found in possession of a prohibited drug contrary to section 3(1) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 and section 170(2) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 and in the light of this it seems right to cancel your leave on the ground that your exclusion from the UK is conducive to the public good. I therefore cancel your leave to (enter) (remain).

**Paragraph 321A(5) 704**

Cancellation Code

**Exclusion conducive to the public good – intention to commit criminal offence**

“... but I have reason to believe that you have come for the purpose of (...) which involves the commission of a criminal offence and in the light of this it seems right to cancel your leave on the ground that your exclusion from the UK is conducive to the public good. I therefore cancel your leave to (enter) (remain).

**Paragraph 321A(5) 704**

Cancellation Code

**Exclusion conducive to the public good – previous criminal conviction / IO discretion**

“... but I have reason to believe that you have been convicted of the offence shown below:

(Date and Place of conviction) (Offence)

and in the light of your conduct as evidenced by (this) (these) offence(s), it seems right to cancel your leave on the ground that your exclusion from the UK is conducive to the public good. I therefore cancel your leave to (enter) (remain).

**Exclusion conducive to the public good – Association - IO discretion**

“... but in the light of your association with ...(who...), it seems right to cancel your leave on the ground that your exclusion from the UK is conducive to the public good. I therefore cancel your leave to (enter) (remain).

**Paragraph 321A(5) 704**

Cancellation Code

**Exclusion conducive to the public good – Danger to public order – IO discretion**

“... but I have reason to believe that you have come for the purpose of (.....) which will endanger the maintenance of public order and in the light of this it seems right to cancel your leave on the ground that your exclusion from the UK is conducive to the public good. I therefore cancel your leave to (enter) (remain).

**Paragraph 321A(5) 704**

Cancellation Code

**IN CASES WHERE THE PERSON IS OUTSIDE THE UK ONLY****Failure to supply appropriate documentation**

“... but you have failed to supply the necessary documentation in support of your application for entry into the United Kingdom as requested by the immigration officer. I therefore cancel your leave / refuse you leave to (enter) (remain)
